James Anderson is head of Skadden's European tax practice. He is highly experienced in private capital arrangements, with a particular focus on the establishment and ongoing operations of asset management structures; investments in liquid markets, infrastructure, crypto, real estate and credit; and compensation for private capital principals.

Mr. Anderson regularly counsels on the full range of public capital markets transactions, including IPOs, SPACs and structured debt offerings. He has also advised various governments on new corporate and tax laws. Recently, his practice has focused on new intersections between private capital and technology, particularly in high-frequency, algorithmic and augmented intelligence trading sectors, as well as handling corporate groups' planning in response to Pillar 2.

Mr. Anderson has been ranked for over a decade in the first tier for tax, by *Chambers UK*, *Chambers Europe* and *Chambers Global*, which also lists Skadden's Tax Group in Band 1 of its Global Tax rankings. In *Chambers UK's* 2026 edition, clients remarked that he is "a very experienced advisor and demonstrates a lot of intellectual rigor" and that "he is very technical, but understands our business very well." In addition, *The Legal 500* ranks Mr. Anderson in its Hall of Fame, with clients noting he is "a class above" and "an industry icon, unsurpassed in his field." He has also been repeatedly ranked as Highly Regarded in the Tax Controversy category of *ITR World Tax*. In addition, Mr. Anderson is currently recognised by *Legal Experts*, *PLC Cross-Border Tax on Transactions Handbook*, *Tax Directors Handbook*, *Lawdragon Insights: Private Funds*, *Lawdragon's 500 Leading Global Tax Lawyers* and *The Best Lawyers in the UK* in its Tax Law and Investment Funds Law categories. Mr. Anderson is also listed as a leader in *International Tax Review's Tax Controversy Leaders Guide* and named in Euromoney/Legal Media Group's *Expert Guides' Guide to the Worlds' Leading Tax Lawyers* and *Turnaround & Workouts Bankruptcy Tax Specialists* in the Nation's Major Law Firms list. In 2025, Mr. Anderson was appointed to *International Tax Review's* inaugural editorial board.

Under his leadership, Skadden's European tax practice has been named Best International Tax Team of the Year by Tolley's Taxation Awards, as well as Transatlantic Tax Team of the Year by *The American Lawyer* and *Legal Week* at the Transatlantic Legal Awards. The firm has repeatedly been ranked as the Best Law Firm for Tax Law by *Vault's* law firm rankings and named Tax Group of the Year by *Law360*. Mr. Anderson has frequently presented at seminars on the taxation of space and AI and has been quoted in several publications on these growing areas of law. In 2019, he chaired the Space Taxation seminar at the IFA Global Congress in London.

Mr. Anderson is a member of the International Bar Association and the International Fiscal Association (IFA) British Branch committee. He also is a member of the HMRC/HMT Consultation Group for the U.K. fund management industry and vice chair of the Tax Committee for the Alternative Investment Management Association, lobbying for good practice in the taxation of U.K. and cross-border asset management activities. In addition, he serves as a member of the HMRC Transfer Pricing Forum and various other stakeholder committees.

In 2025, Mr. Anderson was named by the Lady Chief Justice to the Pro Bono Recognition List for England & Wales for his commitment to *pro bono* work, both at the firm and in the community. He assisted in the establishment of a bridge fund for Shell Foundation in relation to mobility and access to renewable energy in Africa and Asia, worked with the Global Fund to End Slavery for the Walk Free organization and helped structure Create Streets, a charity dedicated to neighbourhood planning and alleviating housing shortages in the U.K. He has also advised Shivia, an organisation that aims to empower indigent families in India by creating livelihoods, Women@TheTable initiative sponsored by the United Nations, and ElectHer, an organization dedicated to promoting greater representation of women in the political class. Additionally, Mr. Anderson supervises Skadden London's JUST Programme, which provides an entry point for undergraduate students who want to pursue a legal career in social justice. He also assists the PRIME Programme with workshops for underprivileged local students.
