In addition to her roles in federal government, Ms. Askey spent over two decades as a tax controversy and policy practitioner at several law and accounting firms and in private industry, where she represented clients in litigation, examinations and at Appeals. She also advised on regulatory and legislative tax policy matters before Treasury, the IRS and congressional staff. Her practice spanned a variety of domestic and international tax issues, with an emphasis on tax accounting, research and development credits and expenses, and energy tax.
