Ms. Byrne has represented clients in numerous FERC enforcement investigations involving alleged market manipulation, as well as alleged violations of reliability standards. She has represented clients in complex contract litigation and other commercial disputes, including litigation arising out of the California energy crisis and issues related to Regional Transmission Organization withdrawal. Her practice also includes counseling clients on FERC regulatory issues and evaluating and developing their FERC compliance programs. She has counseled numerous clients on issues related to qualifying facilities under the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act. Ms. Byrne also has represented clients in federal district court litigation of FERC civil penalty claims.

Ms. Byrne has been selected for inclusion in *Chambers USA*. She also serves as the president of the Charitable Foundation of the Energy Bar Association, and she has been a member of the board of directors since 2015.

Ms. Byrne has been actively involved in *pro bono* matters throughout her career, dedicating substantial time and effort to serving the diverse legal needs of the indigent.

Representative matters include:

- representing NextEra in its acquisition of Gulf Power from Southern Companies;
- representing defendants in a FERC civil penalty assessment action currently pending in federal district court in the Eastern District of Virginia;
- representing clients in a number of pending nonpublic FERC enforcement investigations involving issues including compliance with NERC reliability standards and federal statutes and other issues;
- successfully represented developer in seeking declaratory order on Federal Power Act Waiver issues;
- filed a successful petition for declaratory order on behalf of PJM and secured a FERC order vindicating enforceability of tort liability limitation under attack from civil tort litigant;
- represented Deutsche Bank in a FERC show cause order proceeding arising from enforcement investigation and negotiated settlement resolving investigation;
- led trial team for FirstEnergy Service Company in FERC administrative litigation involving the alleged liability of a withdrawing transmission owner regarding multi-value project charges involving Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator, Inc.;
- successfully defended FirstEnergy Corp. in a complaint proceeding alleging miscellaneous violations associated with capacity auctions and market-based rate authorization, and obtained order denying complaint and declining to initiate enforcement investigation;

- successfully represented Colstrip Energy Limited Partnership in contested qualifying facilities (QF) proceeding involving waste "rib" coal; FERC granted recertification and rejected challenge to QF status;
