While an attorney in the Tax Division, he represented the government in district court and bankruptcy court litigation, and successfully tried multiple cases. As an Assistant U.S. Attorney, he prosecuted tax fraud, securities fraud, health care fraud, child exploitation and drug offenses in the Northern District of New York.

From 2014-19, Mr. Dorfman worked in New York state government, first as an assistant counsel to the governor for taxation and financial services, and then as the general counsel and deputy superintendent for legislative and regulatory affairs for the New York State Department of Financial Services. In the latter role, he was responsible for regulatory issues involving insurance companies, state-chartered banks and licensed financial services firms, the department’s portfolio of affirmative and defense litigation, and the development of regulations and legislative initiatives impacting New York insurance, banking and financial services laws.
