

Notably, he played a central role in achieving a first-of-its-kind resolution of talc-related liabilities under Section 524(g) of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code for a Sumitomo subsidiary — an outcome regarded as a major development in mass tort restructuring.

Mr. Fish's cross-border experience enables him to successfully represent a global client base, with an emphasis on companies in the Asia Pacific region, generally, and those in Japan, in particular.

Prior to his role at Sumitomo, Mr. Fish clerked for the Hon. Leo Glasser in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York and worked as a litigation attorney at another global law firm.
