A Spanish speaker, Ms. Permesly focuses much of her practice on disputes arising out of Latin America. Her diverse practice has included working with clients to identify and implement global strategies to address litigation, arbitration, regulatory, antitrust, conflict of laws, and internal investigation and corruption issues.

Ms. Permesly has been recognized by *Chambers Global*, *Chambers USA*, *Chambers Latin America*, *Chambers Brazil*, *The Legal 500 U.S.* and *The Legal 500 Latin America* for her skills in international arbitration. Ms. Permesly previously served as a term member of the Council on Foreign Relations, a leading U.S.-based foreign policy think tank. She frequently speaks in both Spanish and English on a wide range of topics relating to arbitration and cross-border litigation.
